Jannik Sinner, the World No 1 and top seed, has been knocked out in a shock result on Day 5 at the 2026 French Open.

A clearly struggling Sinner faded in searing heat and lost against Juan Manuel Cerúndolo, 3-6, 2-6, 7-5, 6-1, 6-1.

Rising star Moïse Kouame, 17, Naomi Osaka (16) and Frances Tiafoe (19) were victorious earlier today.

Women's singles top seed Aryna Sabalenka is also through, with American hopeful Ben Shelton currently on court.

That's a bit of a sloppy game from Ben Shelton who is broken by Raphael Collignon, with the Belgium 4-3 up in the first set and now on serve.

Collignon seems to have worked out how to return Shelton's big serve, with the American hitting a loose drop shot in the middle of that break.

Work to do.

And after that shock win against Sinner for Juan Manuel, things only got better for the Cerúndolo family as his brother Francisco also won his second round match this afternoon.
